

## Saint Theodore the Tyro And The Miracle of the Kolyva February 22

Today the Greek Orthodox Church remembers the miracle of Saint Theodore the Tyro and Kolyva (boiled wheat).

On the two Saturdays before Lent and the first Saturday of Lent we celebrate Liturgies in which we commemorate our loved ones who have passed on. Lists of names are brought, together with Kolyva.



Fifty years after the death of Saint Theodore, the emperor Julian the Apostate (361-363), wanting to commit an outrage upon the Christians during the first week of Great Lent, commanded the city-commander of Constantinople to sprinkle all the food provisions in the marketplaces with the blood offered to idols. Saint Theodore appeared in a dream to Archbishop Eudoxius, ordering him to inform all the Christians that no one should buy anything at the marketplaces,

Today the Greek Orthodox Church remembers the miracle of Saint Theodore the Tyro and Kolyva (boiled wheat). On the two Saturdays before Lent and the first Saturday of Lent we celebrate Liturgies in which we commemorate our loved ones who have passed on. Lists of names are brought, together with Kolyva.

On Friday evening, at the Divine Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts following the prayer at the ambo, the Canon to the holy Great Martyr Theodore, composed by Saint John of Damascus, is sung. After this, Kolyva is blessed and distributed to the faithful. The Troparion to Saint Theodore is quite similar to the Troparion for the Prophet Daniel and the Three Holy Youths (December 17, Sunday Before Nativity). The Kontakion to Saint Theodore, who suffered martyrdom by fire, reminds us that he also had faith as his breastplate (see I Thessalonians 5:8).

#### New Year, New NET

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Welcome to the newly renovated version of *The Net*! Just like houses, hairstyles, or cars, an update is refreshing. I'm grateful to Fr. Nick for

all his work in creating and maintaining *The Net* all these previous years. But there's a lot to love about this new, cleaner copy. What I love most is (nerd alert) that we've migrated the newsletter from Microsoft Word to Microsoft Publisher which will give us a lot more flexibility with how we use our space, and the modern design minimizes our frustration working within Word's constraints. I'm extremely excited to debut it to you, and I'm thankful for Cindy's assistance in making the redesign a reality for us. Please let me call attention to three noticeable differences:

**Monthly Events** – The previous design had a redundancy, where all the monthly events were typed out on page three, and then again provided in the calendar. If you want to see what the month holds for Holy Trinity, *you need to check the calendar*. I assure you, if an event is in our public calendar by the 25<sup>th</sup> of the month, it will make it to the print version.

The Calendar — We've made a clean and beautiful calendar, which is on the last page so you can cut it out if you wish. You'll notice that the calendar no longer has regularly scheduled liturgical services, favoring instead to call attention to deviations from the schedule (e.g. memorials). We have Orthros (at 8:50) and Divine Liturgy (at 10) every Sunday morning. We also have Sunday School every Sunday morning. We have confession and Paraklesis every Wednesday night. It will be blatantly displayed if something changes. For example: this month we won't have Paraklesis on Wednesday nights, and you'll see it on the calendar.


Communication – There's a lot going on here, not just at Holy Trinity but with Orthodox Christians all over the Ohio Valley and into Pittsburgh. The new design will allow us to better share multiple flyers or reports from different areas without creating errors in the newsletter. We also freed up space so you can hear from other leaders in the parish, such as our Parish Council president, Tony Mougianis, who graciously wrote a small introductory message on short notice.

Beyond that I hope you like the new design, and the freedom we have to communicate better all of the fun things happening here at Holy Trinity. As a web developer I learned to release a product that might not be as perfect as I want, in order to see what might not be working, and then make changes. Please bear with us if you see any flaws in our design.



#### EXPLORING MUSICAL CONNECTIONS

"How Sweet the Sound" is an innovative musical event taking place February 1 at 3:00 p.m. at Annunciation Cathedral in Columbus. Through the performances and presentations, the conference asks: What can a musical style from one Christian tradition reveal about another? What can we learn about one another through musical collaboration and experimentation? And how can music help us build bridges across communities? This event will explore the connections between Eastern Orthodoxy and Black Gospel music by presenting a newlycomposed setting of the Orthodox Vespers in a Black Gospel style. The composer, Dr. Shawn Wallace, is a professor of jazz at The Ohio State University and a convert to Orthodoxy. The performers are experts in the Black Gospel tradition.

The performance will be preceded by presentations from Dr. Peter Bouteneff, a professor of Systemic Technology at St. Vladimir's Seminary (who also directs of the Arvo Part project there) and Father Moses Berry, a priest of the Orthodox Church of America who specializes in the connections between African Orthodoxy and the African-American experience. 


